The Changing Pastoral Relationship By Pastor David Tinker

Whenever there is a change of call for a pastor there are relational changes which take place. I recognize that these changes are both necessary and sometimes a bit difficult. Even so, it is an important thing that I share with you the plans and promises for our future way of relating.

The foundation of all that I share is reverence and love for God, the broader church, this congregation, and the congregation which I will be serving in the future.

It is important that members and friends of Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine, Texas, and Waldeck Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ledbetter, understand and accept the terms of this plan in order that relationships with new pastoral staff develop in positive ways. As of February 28, 2025, I will relinquish all pastoral and administrative duties as Pastor, and I will no longer function as the pastor of either MLLC or Waldeck. I am determined to be completely supportive of the future pastoral and lay leadership of both Waldeck and MLLC. I will not receive negative comments or participate in any conversation or activity which might undermine any program or person of either church.

Any future contacts which may occur will be simply as friends. I will not participate in any weddings, funerals, or baptisms, nor will I engage in any hospital or pastoral visitation with the people of either congregation. This is because it is important that the new pastoral leader bond with the congregations through these ministry functions. This standard is founded in love and care for all involved. I will need to be focused on what God and Church have called me to be doing at Christ Lutheran of Elm Creek. If I were to be heading back to do pastoral duties, I would be both neglecting my called ministry in Elm Creek and interfering with the ministry of Waldeck and MLLC.

I assert this standard because of my deep affection for you all. I also assert this standard because of my care for future pastors. It has not happened at MLLC or Waldeck, but at some previous congregations where I have served, former pastors were often seeking to be involved inappropriately in weddings and funerals. These actions prevented opportunities for the me and the family to grow a pastoral connection. Everybody missed out on good things due to this.

Founded in respect for God and the Church, I lovingly request that you refrain from asking me to come back to perform any pastoral duties.

Anniversary events for either congregation are a different thing altogether. It is common and friendly to invite former pastors to visit when a special event occurs. For example, in 2019 I accepted the invitation to the 150th Anniversary event for the church I served in Ohio. I saw other former pastors at that event as well. If invited, I would be honored to participate in such events.

These plans and promises are offered to the people of both MLLC and Waldeck, for the sole purpose of strengthening mission and ministry in the future. It grows out of deep gratitude for the past 12+ years at MLLC and the past 8+ years at Waldeck, and for our significant ministry in these congregations.
